Case Studies FY22 Achievements - Year in Review



Case Study 1: Co-designed a learning module with the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission called "Everybody has a story: Delivering Culturally Inclusive Care" which will be available for free to all employees of Commonwealth-funded aged care providers

Case Study 2: Supported partnerships between aged care providers. CALD communities and the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care and it's "Better Connecting With Diverse Communities Project" to support free translations in the aged care sector in line with the Department of Health and Aged Care's Budget measure

Case study 3: Informed an aged care manager about the consumer voice film and advice around culturally appropriate care, including dementia care, and provided information on the Centre's website and resources, including communication cards in Italian and Italian-specific services

Case study 4: Hosted the National Cultural Diversity in Ageing's Excellence Awards and recognising nine aged care leaders and organisations on good practice relating to commitment to diversity and the delivery of culturally appropriate care

Case study 5: Provided feedback on the draft My Aged Care Specialisation Verification Framework including how to make sure it will be consumer-friendly for diverse consumers and alerted to the use of culturally appropriate language

Case study 6: Provided advice to an aged care organisation in developing a diversity strategy. The Centre will also showcase the organisation's work in the diversity, equity, and inclusion space through social media.

Case study 7: Provided advice to an aged care peak body on relevant training content in the area of culturally inclusive care. The Centre also discussed issues relating to culturally appropriate food policies and invited the provider to present on one of its webinars

Case study 8: Conducted a training session with a local council to 85 home care workers on culturally appropriate care and cross cultural communication

Case Study 9: Provided details to an aged care provider on Russian-specific aged care support services and referred the provider to the Centre's multilingual communication cards in Russian.

Case study 10: The Centre was accepted to present its submission at a hearing in relation to the Victorian Parliamentary enquiry into the support for elderly migrants and refugees

Case study 11: Development of a consumer voice film "You Can Ask For What You Need from Aged Care Services" encouraging culturally inclusive feedback and translated into 15 languages

Case study 12: Development of five new languages in the communication cards and aged care signage and two new practice guides to support culturally appropriate care
